Laser Main Treatment for Serious Fetlock Injury

Just had to write and tell you about Magic's latest mishap. Seems as though that horse just likes to put his foot where it doesn't belong!

I had been keeping Magic in a paddock with a couple of other saddle horses when somehow he managed to cut his fetlock. It was deep and I wasn't sure how badly damaged the fetlock was. Turned out that while he had a deep cut, he hadn't damaged any of the tendons or other structures in the leg. The protocol to deal with his leg was very reminiscent of his first surgery – twice daily washes with foaming stabilized oxygen, a spray of aloe recovery gel and twenty minutes with the LazrPulsr device. Boy, I don't know what I would do without a laser to help keep Magic healthy. Bottom line is that, as the photos show, Magic's fetlock was perfectly healthy five weeks later – with minimal scarring, nice hair re-growth and no lameness!

While I am pleased about the miracle the laser brought about, I still haven't decided what to do with an animal that keeps putting his feet where they don't belong!
