They Said He'd Never Be Able to Leave the Nursing Home

My husband was hospitalized during the spring of 2008 due to a fall that resulted in a hip fracture. At 90+, he was considered high risk following his surgery. He was sent to a nursing facility and I was cautioned that due to his age and potential complications, we shouldn't expect him to regain the ability to walk – even after his stay and physical therapy. He's always been a very determined man and there was no way he WASN'T going to go home.

Our children got us a Personal LazrPulsr device and taught me to use it. They worked with you and your staff to decide on the best protocols for Alvin. After about a week in the hospital, he was sent to a mid-level nursing facility where he stayed for about six weeks. After twice daily treatments with LazrPulsr, he was walking well enough to be released. No way this would have happened without his laser – and it helped his chronic back pain as well. Unfortunately, we didn't know that he was also battling virulent cancer at the same time and he passed away at home in July of 2008.

We continue to believe the laser is an important tool for those of us who are aging, chronically ill, or dealing with other debilitating conditions.
